

EVANGELIZATION: \$2.5 MILLION

Supporting families, parishes and schools in missionary disciple formation is vital to fostering evangelization. Appeal doctors will support marriage preparation classes and couple enrichment programs. Funding will also provide resources and training to revitalize parish life towards a Eucharistic Way of Living through a whole family catechetical approach in parish formation based on applying the catechumenal model (OCIA).

CATHOLIC EDUCATION & TUITION ASSISTANCE: \$1.5 MILLION

Catholic schools are a ministry of the Church and lay the foundation for evangelization. Appeal funds will provide tuition assistance to families seeking a Catholic education for their children and support for continued education and formation opportunities for teachers.

VOCATIONS: \$2.3 MILLION

Through continued efforts in evangelization, our diocese is experiencing increased awareness and interest in vocations. The Appeal will help support seminarian costs, including tuition and room and board, as well as ongoing discernment and formation activities and experiences.

SOCIAL NEEDS: \$1.2 MILLION

Helping our brothers and sisters feel Christ's love and mercy. Appeal funds will directly impact vital work in serving mothers and their children and defending life at every stage and condition. Support will also be provided for the coordination of the prison ministry to serve the spiritual needs of inmates in the twelve correctional facilities in the diocese. Furthermore, Appeal funds will support agencies affiliated with Catholic Social Service as they serve the needs of he vulnerable members of the community by providing essential services such as food, clothing, care for families, assistance to newcomers, services for seniors and behavioral healthcare for children.

Why is Saturday Dedicated to Our Lady?

According to the habits of Catholic piety, Friday is dedicated to the Passion of Our Lord Jesus Christ. This fact is very explicable because He died on a Friday.

Sunday is dedicated to the Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ. That is also explicable: He resurrected on a Sunday.

Between Friday and Sunday there is Saturday. That day brings with it a sad rather than cheerful connotation because the Sabbath was the day consecrated to the Lord in the old synagogue. It was God's day, the day when creation had been completed.

How should Catholic piety fill Saturday, a day placed between two other exalted days?

As we all know, Saturday is dedicated to Our Lady.

Why is Saturday dedicated to Our Lady? Why, for example, were the first Saturdays of the month chosen for the Communion of reparation? What are the profound reasons for this Catholic custom of dedicating Saturday to Our Lady?

The reason has been found in documentation from the Abbey of Cluny:

"Devotion to Our Lady received a great impulse in the beginning of the tenth century with the monastic reform led by Cluny, the Order that built medieval civilization. It was then that the habit of dedicating Saturday especially to her became widespread."

Order of Cluny Propagates Devotion to Our Lady: "For example, Saint Hugh, Abbot of Cluny, determined that when no unmovable feast occurred on a Saturday, the Office of the Blessed Virgin Mary should be sung in all monasteries of Cluny, and the Mass "De Beata Virgine," that is, the liturgy especially composed in her praise, should be celebrated. Pope Urban II ordered that the Little Office of Our Lady be added to the Office of the Church on Saturdays."

This shows the impulse that the Order of Cluny gave to devotion to Our Lady, and particularly on Saturdays.

It continues: "While there are several explanations for this custom of dedicating Saturday to Mary Most Holy, the one most widespread in Christendom that moved souls with special veneration to the Blessed Virgin was a result of the great importance the Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ enjoyed in medieval spirituality."

"The Gospels tell us that after the death of Our Lord Jesus Christ, the Apostles, disciples and holy women did not believe in the Resurrection even though Our Lord had often foretold it to them."

"Thus, from the time Our Lord died on the Cross on Good Friday until Resurrection Sunday, only Our Lady believed in His Divinity. Therefore, she alone had perfect faith, for as Saint Paul says, "Without the Resurrection our Faith would be in vain." Therefore, on that Saturday, only Our Lady personified the Catholic Church throughout the Earth and medieval men praised her especially on that day."

Between Good Friday and Easter Sunday only Our Lady believes in the Resurrection!

This explanation could not be more beautiful. As every Catholic knows, this fact is real. It would be exaggerated to say that the holy women and the Apostle Saint John the Evangelist, had lost their Faith, but they had no faith in the Resurrection. They had not realized it would take place - even though Our Lord had repeatedly spoken of it.

Accordingly, at every passing minute the sword of longing and pain somehow plunged even deeper into Her Immaculate Heart. But on the other hand she had certainty and great joy over the coming victory. And for her this was obviously a reason for consolation and joy.

Since on that occasion she alone represented the Faith we can say that if she had not done so, the world would have ended, for the world cannot exist without Faith. Were Faith for a moment to cease to exist in the world, Providence would put an end to it. Because of Our Lady's admirable Faith, she alone sustained the world and gave continuity to the promises of the Gospel.

Until the triumph of the Immaculate Heart comes we are living a great Holy Saturday in which one would say that everything we love lies in the grave without balms and in disorder, contempt, hatred and abandonment.

However, outside there are not just a couple of guards, but jailers from all over the world. We, together with Our Lady, are certain of victory. It is so reasonable for us to say:

O Immaculate, Wise and Most Faithful Heart of Mary, give me the grace to be immaculate, particularly in purity. Give me the grace to be entirely wise and thus to have an unshakeable fidelity, so that even if the world seemed to fall apart and the stars fell from the sky and the columns of the Earth cracked we would still say calmly, patiently, with dynamism, apostolic vigour and courage: "Her Immaculate Heart will triumph!"

Why the Five First Saturday Devotion? Jesus asked Sister Lucia, on May 29,1930, to make reparation for 5 kinds of offenses & blasphemies against the Immaculate Heart of Mary: 1) blasphemies against Her Immaculate Conception; 2) against Her Perpetual Virginity; 3) against the Divine and Spiritual Maternity of Mary; 4) blasphemies involving the rejection and dishonoring of Her images; and 5) the neglect of implanting in the hearts of children a knowledge and love of this Immaculate Mother.

"Have Compassion on the Heart of Your Most Holy Mother, covered with thorns, with which ungrateful men pierce It at every moment, and there is no one to make an act of reparation to remove them." ...Jesus to Sister Lucia of Fatima.

Jubilee Year of the Sacred Heart of Jesus

We are in the midst of the Jubilee Year of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. It began on December 27, 2023 (*December 27th, was the date of the first apparition*) and concludes on June 27, 2025, the date of the Solemnity of the Feast of the Sacred Heart. The Jubilee commemorates the 350th anniversary of the apparitions of the Sacred Heart to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque.

In 2024 the Feast of the Sacred Heart is coming on Friday, June 7th. It is not too early to plan how you want to celebrate this feast: you could begin the Nine First Fridays (if you haven't already); you could plan to pray a novena prior; or you might want to consecrate your family and your home to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

The Sacred Heart badge is another sacramental you can carry on your person or put in your car to keep Jesus always with you! Our Lady will be providing badges for the people in the parish!

Catholics Participating in National Eucharistic Pilgrimage and the National Eucharistic Congress Have Opportunities Public Affairs to Receive Plenary Indulgences!



WASHINGTON – "It is with gratitude to the Holy Father that we

receive his Apostolic Blessing upon the participants in the National Eucharistic Congress, and for the opportunity for Catholics in our country to obtain a plenary indulgence by participating in the events of the Eucharistic Revival," said Archbishop Timothy P. Broglio, president of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops. Fostering encounter, sparking personal conversion, and forming disciples will be opportunities for a personal revival in the faith and the fruits of the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage and National Eucharistic Congress to be held this summer.

The National Eucharistic Pilgrimage and National Eucharistic Congress are milestone moments in the U.S. bishops' three-year Eucharistic Revival initiative. Archbishop Broglio requested the Apostolic Penitentiary (the office within the Roman Curia that is charged with the granting and use of indulgences as expressions of divine mercy) that a plenary indulgence be granted to Catholics who participate in the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage. It was also requested that he or another prelate be designated to impart the Apostolic Blessing with a Plenary Indulgence to the Christian faithful present at the National Eucharistic Congress.

"Through the efforts of the revival over the last two years, we have been building up to the pilgrimage and congress that will offer Catholics a chance to experience a profound, personal revival of faith in the Eucharist. Pope Francis continues to encourage and support us as we seek to share Christ's love with a world that is desperately in need of Him," said Archbishop Broglio, upon receiving the news that Pope Francis had recently granted the requests.

Plenary Indulgence for National Eucharistic Pilgrimage

A decree issued by the Apostolic Penitentiary and approved by Pope Francis indicates that the plenary indulgence will be granted to the Christian faithful who participate in the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage at any point between May 17 and July 16, 2024. It will also be granted to the elderly, infirm, and all those who cannot leave their homes for a serious reason and who participate in spirit with the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage, uniting their prayers, pains, or inconveniences with Christ and the pilgrimage. This indulgence is granted under the usual conditions of sacramental Confession, Eucharistic Communion, and prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father. The faithful may also apply this indulgence through suffrage for the souls of the faithful departed in Purgatory. In recognition of this extraordinary event, the Apostolic Penitentiary also requests that all priests who have been endowed with the appropriate faculties for hearing Confessions present themselves willingly and generously in administering the Sacrament of Penance to all who participate in the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage.

Papal Blessing with Plenary Indulgence for National Eucharistic Congress

The second decree issued by the Apostolic Penitentiary and approved by Pope Francis, says that Archbishop Broglio or another prelate of episcopal rank assigned by him, following the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, may impart the Papal Blessing with a Plenary

Indulgence to the Christian Faithful who participate in the National Eucharistic Congress, who are truly repentant, and who are motivated by charity, if the usual conditions for indulgences—sacramental Confession, Eucharistic Communion, and prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father—have been met. Faithful individuals who, due to reasonable circumstances and with pious intention, have participated in the sacred rites and received the Papal Blessing through media communications, may also obtain a Plenary Indulgence.

The National Eucharistic Revival began on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) in 2022 and continues through 2025. Following the congress will be a "Year of Missionary Sending," in which Catholics from all stages and walks of life will be sent out to share Christ's love that they have received in encounter with him through the Eucharist. WHAT ARE THE GREAT FEASTS THAT FOLLOW THE EASTER SEASON?

Jesus' final work on Earth is the Ascension. It is the celebration of Jesus' return to Heaven, to God the Father. Until recent times Ascension Thursday was a holy day of obligation. Today, many bishops have moved the celebration of Ascension to the Sunday following thus removing the 'obligation' from the weekday Mass. It is still best to attend Mass on Ascension Thursday if at all possible.

The Easter candle is removed from beside the Ambo and returned to the Baptismal Font area. The candle will be lit at Baptisms and funerals throughout the year. Following the Ascension the Apostles returned to the Upper Room in fear to await Jesus' promise of the Paraclete. The first novena – there are nine days between Ascension Thursday and Pentecost!



Pentecost (Whitsunday – England & Ireland)

The birthday of the Church! The feast commemorates the Descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and all those with them in the Upper Room on the 10th day after the Ascension. The Apostles received the seven gifts and immediately went forth from their locked room to proclaim Jesus' Resurrection to the world and baptized 3000!

The Feast of Pentecost falls 50 days after the Resurrection! *Pentecost* is the Greek for "the fiftieth". In Jesus' time this event overlaid the Jewish festival of Pentecost also known as "the feast of weeks" (Ex. 34:22; Deut. 16:10) and there is one more parallel - it was also the commemoration of God giving Moses 'the Law', the Ten Commandments on Mt. Sinai!

Mother of the Church

(Latin: *Mater Ecclesiae*), instituted into the Roman Calendar by Pope Francis in 2018. There is a long history of this title, as officially declared by Pope Paul VI in 1964. The title first appeared in the 4th century writings of Saint Ambrose of Milan. It was also used by Pope Benedict XIV in 1748 and then by Pope Leo XIII in 1885. Pope John Paul II placed it in the Catechism of the Catholic Church and it was Pope Francis who inserted the feast into the Roman Calendar in 2018 to follow on the day after Pentecost. The Dogma of the Blessed Trinity



The Trinity is the central doctrine of Christianity — the truth that in the unity of the Godhead there are Three Persons, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, these Three Persons being truly distinct one from another.

Thus, in the words of the Athanasian Creed: "the Father is God, the Son is God, and the Holy Spirit is God, and yet there are **not** three Gods but one God." In this Trinity of Persons the Son is begotten of the Father by an eternal generation, and the Holy Spirit proceeds by an eternal procession from the Father and the Son. Yet, notwithstanding this difference as to origin, the Persons are co-eternal and co-equal: all alike are uncreated and omnipotent. This, the Church teaches, is the revelation regarding God's nature which Jesus Christ, the Son of God, came upon Earth to deliver to the world: and which she proposes to man as the foundation of her whole dogmatic system.

Feast of Corpus Christi - Feast of the Body of Christ



It seems that in the early Church this feast was celebrated on the Thursday following Holy Thursday. However, it was St. Juliana (1193-1258) who, from her youth, had a great veneration for the Blessed Sacrament and longed and interceded for a special feast in Its honor. She went to Robert de Thorete, then Bishop of Liege; later, to Jacques Pantaleon, then Archdeacon of Liege who became Pope Urban IV on August 29, 1261. Robert was favorable to her request, (bishops then had the right of ordering feasts for their dioceses) in 1247 he ordered the celebration to be held the following year. Bishop Robert died in October of 1246 before the feast was first celebrated by the canons of St. Martin at Liege. Pope Urban published the Bull "Transiturus" (September 8, 1264) ordering the annual celebration of Corpus Christi on the Thursday next after Trinity Sunday. Source: excerpted from newadvent.org

There is also the account of the village priest and his congregation who witnessed a Eucharistic miracle of the bleeding Consecrated Host at <u>Bolsena</u>, (he had doubts as to Jesus Real Presence in the Eucharist). The feast was inspired by his procession, with the evidence, to Orvieto in 1263 to show it to the pope. The corporal with the blood stain is preserved in the Cathedral of Orvieto.
