St. Martin de Porres

Feast Day: November 3 Patron of Barbers Died: 1639

St. Martin de Porres was born at Lima, Peru, in 1579. His father was a Spanish gentleman and his mother a colored freed-woman from Panama.

At fifteen, he became a lay brother at the Dominican Friary at Lima and spent his whole life there-as a barber, farm laborer, almoner, and infirmarian among other things.

Martin had a great desire to go off to some foreign mission and thus earn the palm of martyrdom. However, since this was not possible, he made a martyr out of his body, devoting himself to ceaseless and severe penances. In turn, God endowed him with

many graces and wondrous gifts, such as, aerial flights and bilocation.

St. Martin's love was allembracing, shown equally to humans and to animals, including vermin, and he maintained a cats and dogs hospital at his sister's house. He also possessed spiritual wisdom, demonstrated in his solving his sister's marriage




problems; raising a dowry for his niece inside of three day's time; and resolving theological problems for the learned of his Order and for bishops. He was a close friend of St. Rose of Lima. This saintly man died on November 3, 1639 and was canonized on May 6, 1962. Source:www.catholic.org

FIVE MARIAN MARTYRS ON THE ROAD TO CANONIZATION

-from the Marian Helper - monthly publication of the Marian Fathers of the Immaculate Conception

Servant of God Fabian Abrantowicz, Sept. 14, 1884-Jan. 2, 1946

Archimandrite Fabian (serving as apostolic administrator of the Easter Rite Catholics in China) was arrested by German forces while trying to leave Poland on Oct 22, 1939. He was taken to the local Soviet police headquarters where he was charged with membership in a Catholic religious congregation which was actively opposing the Soviet authority and communism. In January 1941, he was transported to Butyrki prison in Moscow and died there on January 2, 1946.

Servant of God Andrew Cikoto, Dec. 5, 1891 - Feb 13, 1952

Fr. Andrew was chosen by Pope Pius XII to replace Archimandrite Fabian. On December 22, 1948, the Chinese forces surrounded the mission house in Harbin and arrested everyone there. Three days later they were handed over to the Soviets. Fr. Andrew was imprisoned in the city of Chita, Siberia, and accused of inciting people against the Soviet Union and espionage (for the Vatican). He was sentenced to 25 years of forced labor on September 28, 1949. His health was ruined from severe interrogation at the beginning of his incarceration and he died in the prison hospital in Ozernoye on February 13, 1952.

Servant of God Eugene Kulesza. March 8, 1891 - June 30, 1941

He was assigned to Bielany College of the Marian Fathers in Warsaw in the beginning of 1926, teaching and serving as confessor. In 1938 he was assigned as superior of the Marian house in Druya, Belarus. He continued his ministry as the Soviets occupied Belarus. Father Eugene was arrested on June 30, 1941, and murdered by Soviet soldiers fleeing the German forces.

Servant of God Vladislovas "Vladas" Mazonas June 24, 1881 - Jan. 1945

Fr. Vladas served as editor of the Catholic magazine "Saltinis," and wrote about the persecution of Christians under the Soviet Union. After the Soviets occupied Lithuania, Fr. Vladas was arrested on June 14, 1941, and deported to Siberia. His health was ruined due to extensive interrogation and was placed in the prison hospital of Butyrki. He died there in January 1945.

Servant of God John Mendriks Jan. 21, 1907 - August 1, 1953

Arrested on October 25, 1950, by Soviet police, he was sentenced to 10 years forced labor in the camp in Vorkuta for "anti-Soviet activism" on March 24, 1951. In 1953, after Stalin's death there was a political thaw and prisoners began to protest. Camp authorities called in armed forces to surround the camp on August 1, 1953. He stayed with his fellow prisoners so that he could prepare them to meet God. He was shot dead while reciting the formula for absolution.

Moving Souls from Purgatory to Heaven

Three means....

There are many various prayers and means composed for this singular purpose and you will find three of the most efficacious listed here.

1) Visit a Catholic Cemetery

Each November, the Church gives us an extraordinary gift that we can extend to our "dear suffering friends." From November 1 -8, a plenary indulgence is available for Catholics in a state of grace who visit a cemetery and pray, even if only mentally, for the dead.

This means that when you visit a cemetery where a loved one is buried and you pray for them during the first 8 days in November, their soul will leave Purgatory and go straight to Heaven.

Besides benefiting the holy souls, visiting a cemetery is a healthy reminder of our own mortality, realizing that we too will pass from this life to the next.

2) Pray the Novena for the Holy Souls

Composed by Saint Alphonsus Liguori, the nine days of prayer for the holy souls in Purgatory is a more prolonged way to pray for the deceased. Traditionally, it is prayed in preparation for All Souls Day or in the days following the celebration.

Novena for the Holy Souls in Purgatory

O most sweet Jesus, through the bloody sweat which Thou didst suffer in the Garden of Gethsemane, have mercy on these Blessed Souls. Have mercy on them.

O most sweet Jesus, through the pains which Thou didst suffer during Thy most cruel scourging, have mercy on them.

O most sweet Jesus, through the pains which Thou didst suffer in carrying Thy Cross to Calvary, have mercy on them.

O most sweet Jesus, through the pains which Thou didst suffer during Thy most cruel Crucifixion, have mercy on them.

R. Have mercy on them, O Lord.

O most sweet Jesus, through the pains which Thou didst suffer in Thy most bitter agony on the Cross, have mercy on them.

R. Have mercy on them, O Lord.

O most sweet Jesus, through the immense pain which Thou didst suffer in breathing forth Thy blessed soul, have mercy on them.

R. Have mercy on them, O Lord.

(Recommend yourself to the Souls in Purgatory and mention your intentions here)

Blessed souls, I have prayed for thee; I entreat thee, who are so dear to God, and who are secure of never losing Him, to pray for me a miserable sinner, who is in danger of being damned, and of losing God forever. *Amen*

3) Pray Saint Gertrude the Great's Prayer for the Holy Souls

One of the most popular prayers for the souls in Purgatory is that of Saint Gertrude the Great. She received many visions of Our Lord during her lifetime and expressed to Our Lord Jesus her great desire to pray for the deceased. In return, Our Lord taught Saint Gertrude the following prayer. It is piously believed that 1,000 souls are released from purgatory by praying this payer with the heart.

Saint Gertrude's Prayer for Holy Souls

Eternal Father, I offer You the most Precious Blood of Your Divine Son, Jesus, in union with the Masses said throughout the world today, for all the holy souls in Purgatory, for all sinners everywhere, for sinners in the universal Church, those in my own home and within my family. *Amen*

Who was Fr. Joseph Steadman, CPpS?

(The priest who wrote the prayer to Christ the King on the front page.)

Joseph Steadman was born to Joseph and Ellen Steadman in Brooklyn, New York as one of five children. After attending St. Joseph's Parochial School and St. Francis

Preparatory School, he entered St. Francis College in Brooklyn, but left after his junior year to enter Fordham College, where he received his Bachelor of Arts degree; he then entered the St. John's Seminary in Brooklyn. He was ordained on May 21, 1921, and was assigned to Holy Child Jesus Parish in Richmond Hill, Queens.

From 1925, Father Steadman was chaplain of the Monastery of the Precious Blood in Brooklyn. He was also Director of the Confraternity of the Precious Blood, which was erected in 1925 at the Monastery Chapel of the Cloistered Sisters Adorers of the Precious Blood. In 1944 Father Steadman was elevated to Monsignor.

His writings include *My Sunday Missal*, with illustrations by Ade Bethune, as well as *My Military Missal**, *My Daily Readings from the Four Gospels*, the "Triple" Novena Manual, and My Lenten Missal. At the time of his death, it was noted that more than 13,000,000 copies of his books had been sold. He died on March 23, 1946, of a brain tumor at the age of forty-eight, at the Columbia-Presbyterian Medical Center.

*My Military Missal was distributed to men in the armed forces from 1941 to 1945. Fr. Steadman would go to the distribution center and walk the length of the concrete floor of the warehouse blessing the boxes of missals with holy water.
